# **Case Specific:** Tree Frogs

Purpose: Enhance teaching/learning with engaging science materials and live animals

**Goal:** Safety for all who handle Living Science materials

## **General Safety:**

ALWAYS WASH HANDS WITH SOAP AND WATER BEFORE AND AFTER HANDLING ANY ANIMAL OR INSECTS.

#### **Process:**

#### 1. Handling:

**Resources: Gloves** 

Note: Latex gloves can cause allergic reactions in some individuals

- It is best to wear gloves for your safety and the safety/health of the tree frog
- Slowly remove lid from container and be careful not to let frog jump out
- No yelling or screaming
- Do not poke at tree frog
- Gently grab the tree frog around its body. Do not let go or they will hop away

#### 2. Caring:

ESC20 Living Science tree frogs are provided with their own habitat which is cleaned upon their arrival back to ESC20 Living Science Center so no bedding from you is necessary

- Fresh, clean water
- Proper food (crickets, not wild caught...wild caught may have been exposed to pesticides and can become harmful to the frog if it decides to eat the wild caught crickets)

#### 3. Disposal:

### Resources: Gloves, plastic bag, dumpster

If pet dies, wrap bedding and dead tree frog tightly in a plastic bag and dispose in dumpster. Return container to ESC20 Living Science Center

#### 4. Bites or Allergic Reaction:

Allergic Reactions: Consult school nurse

### 5. Hygiene:

Resources Needed: Gloves, Soap, Water

Use gloves for handling.

Wash hands with soap and water before and after handling animals or insects.
